Foundation MasterClass

This course is specifically designed for non-final year registrars, old age psychiatry registrars, Parkinson's nurses within the first 18 months of post, OTs, SaLTs, pharmacists, and clinical fellows/lecturers. Set as one module over two days, the course will advance your understanding of Parkinson's and related movement disorders through interactive sessions.

Advanced MasterClass

Tailormade for consultants, experienced Parkinson's nurses, final year registrars, GPwSIs, experienced neurosciences pharmacists, associate specialists and staff grade physicians, this course offers advanced training in both the clinical and managerial aspects of running a 'Parkinson's service'.

Module 1 is set over three days. Each delegate receives one-to-one mentorship from an experienced key opinion leader, and returns for a day for Module 2 to present their project to the group.

Non-Oral Therapies Roadshow

This special course is for professionals who want to understand what best practice for referral and treatment of the non-oral therapies looks like. The day includes:

- What non-oral therapies are and how they work
- What to expect when you make a referral
- Case histories exploring how to use non-oral therapies.

Non-Motor Symptoms Roadshow

Specifically aimed at allied health professionals, these half-day MasterClasses are focused on recognising these challenging symptoms and managing them effectively. A further series of non-motor symptoms roadshows for clinicians is also in the planning stages.

Non-Specialist MasterClass

This course is designed for general neurologists (or neurologists not currently prescribing), registrars and pharmacists, covering recent developments in MS and the skills needed to look after MS patients in the general setting across the full disease course.

Interactive sessions are delivered by leaders in the field in small groups with an emphasis on case-based learning.

Module 1 is set over three days. Each delegate receives one-to-one mentorship and returns for Module 2 to present their project to the group.

Not only does the course provide essential updates on the evidence base for managing MS and build practical skills, it is also an invaluable opportunity to establish an ongoing network of peer support – not just in MS but in other neurological conditions too.

Specialist MasterClass

Tailormade for professionals training to be MS experts to learn how to set up or work within a specialist service, this course is for neurologists who are currently prescribing, experienced MS nurses, final year registrars and pharmacists currently working in an MS service.

This course offers advanced training in both the clinical and managerial aspects of running an 'MS service'.

Learn about developments in the evidence base for managing MS and the advanced skills needed to look after MS patients in a specialist setting across the full disease course, while gaining invaluable practical support about developing a service.

Interactive sessions are delivered by leaders in the field in small groups with an emphasis on case-based learning.

Module 1 is set over three days. Each delegate receives one-to-one mentorship and returns for Module 2 set over two days at which they will present their project and possibly a case study.
